Azzeddine Azzam is professor of agricultural economics at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, USA since April 1987. From January 2010 to December 2011, he served as senior economic advisor at the Dubai Chamber of Commerce and Industry and as the chair of the economics department at the University of Dubai, where he also taught undergraduate microeconomics and MBA managerial economics. He taught applied microeconomics as a Teaching Fellow at Harvard University in the

summer 1997 and empirical industrial organization as a Fulbright Scholar at the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences from July 1999 to June 2000.

He is founder and past director of CAFIO, Center of Agricultural and Food Industrial Organization since 2001 up to 2012, founder and editor of JAFIO: Journal of Agricultural and Food Industrial Organization since 2001, and founder and managing editor of RURALS: Review of Undergraduate Research in Agricultural and Life Sciences since 2006. He is also a lifetime research fellow of the Economic Research Forum since 2000, a member of Phi Beta Delta.

Azzedine Azzam is the recipient of the University of Nebraska 2008 Excellence in Graduate Education Award for Outstanding Contributions to Graduate Education. He also served as associate editor of the American Journal of Agricultural Economics, Western Journal of Agricultural Economics, Agribusiness: An International Journal, and Middle East Development Journal. He has numerous publications in internationally refereed journals.

Eduardo Amaral Haddad



Eduardo Amaral Haddad is Full Professor at the Department of Economics since 2008 at the University of São Paulo, Brazil and is the Director of Research of FIPE, a research foundation at the same University since October 2005. Prof. Haddad also holds a position as Adjunct Associate Professor at the Regional Economics Applications Laboratory (REAL) since January 1998 at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, USA. He is the author of the book "Regional Inequality and Structural Changes: Lessons from the Brazilian Experience" (Ashgate, 1999), and

has published on regional and interregional input-output analysis, general equilibrium modeling, and various aspects of regional economic development in Brazil, in both national and international journals; he has also contributed with chapters in international books in the fields of regional science and economic development. Prof. Haddad has also acted as a consultant for the World Bank, the Inter-American Development Bank, UNDP, OECD, the Joint Africa Institute, and many other public and private organizations, national and international.



Pierre-Richard Agénor

Pierre-Richard Agénor is Hallsworth Professor of International Macroeconomics and Development Economics, University of Manchester, and co-Director, Centre for Growth and Business Cycle Research. He is also Principal Investigator, ESRC-DFID Growth Research Programme; International Research Fellow, Kiel Institute of the World Economy; Senior Fellow, FERDI; Research Associate, CAMA; and Senior Fellow, OCP Policy Center. He has published widely in leading professional

journals and made contributions to a wide range of fields in economics, including international macroeconomics, development economics, growth theory, labor economics, and poverty reduction. He is the author of The Economics of Adjustment and Growth (Harvard University Press), Development Macroeconomics (with P. J. Montiel, Princeton University Press), and more recently Public Capital, Growth and Welfare (Princeton University Press). He has taught and lectured in many universities and research centers around the world, including Columbia University, Georgetown University, and Yale University. He has given seminars and short courses in more than forty countries.



Prakash Loungani

Prakash Loungani is Advisor in the IMF's Research Department and Co-Chair of the IMF's group on Jobs and Growth. He is also an adjunct Professor of Management at Vanderbilt University's Owen School of Business, where he has taught in the Executive MBA program for the past 15 years. During 2013-14, he was on

the World Economic Forum's council on employment issues. His academic work has been published in top-tier journals and the citations to this work place him among the top 5% of economists worldwide. He was the co-author of the IMF's background paper for the ILO-IMF conference in Oslo on tackling unemployment. More recently, he is the co-author (with Olivier Blanchard and Florence Jaumotte) of a paper on 'Labor Market Policies and IMF Advice in Advanced Economies during the Great Recession' and has ongoing work on labor migration.



Rabah Arezki

Rabah Arezki is currently Head of Commodities Unit at the IMF Research Department since 2006. He is Research Affiliate at the CESifo Research Network, Munich, Germany and works as Project Evaluator at the African Economic Research Consortium in Nairobi, Kenya since 2011. He holds several research

positions since 2011: Research Associate at the Economics Department of Oxford University; Research Fellow both at the Economic Research Forum, Cairo Egypt and at the Navarra Center for International Development at the University of Navarra, Pamplona, Spain. Prior to these positions, Rabah Arezki worked as research assistant at the European University Institute in Florence (2006); visiting scholar at the Economics Department of Boston University between September and December 2003; Between 1999 and 2000, he worked as economist at the CEPII for the French Prime Minister's Economic Service in Paris; internship at the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) in Paris, from July to September 1998.
